## TOBACCO CROP REPORT

OTTAWA, February 28, 1948 - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Agriculture, principal Tobacco marketing associations and manufacturing companies, issues to-day a report on acreage, production and value of Tobacco grown in Canada 1947.

## SUMMARY

According to the first estimate, the 1947 tobacco crop is valued at \$41,709,000. Producers are expecting to receive \$7,763,000 less this season than in 1946-47 when the crop was valued at \$49,472,000. While the acreage harvested in 1947 was 13% greater than in the previous year, average yields were off sharply at 928 pounds per acre compared with 1,281 pounds per acre. The value of the crop, by provinces, with comparable data for 1946 in brackets, is: Quebec \$2,646,000, (\$3,383,000); Ontario \$39,029,-000, (\$46,034,000) and British Columbia \$34,000, (\$55,000). Production of tobacco this season is well below the record level set in 1946. The total crop is now estimated at 116,084,000 pounds compared with 141,384,000 pounds. Production in 1947 by types with corresponding information for 1946 in brackets is: flue-cured 94,826,000 pounds, (119,027,000) pounds; burley 14,420,000 pounds, (12,058,000) pounds; dark 1,673,000 pounds, (2,469,000) pounds; cigar 3,560,000 pounds, (5,435,000) pounds; pipe 1,605,000 pounds, (2,395,000) pounds.
