TOBACCO PRODUCTION AND VALUE 1954

The estimated production of leaf tobacco (green weight) in Canada in the crop year ending September 30, 1954 amounted to 184,763,000 pounds approximately 45 million pounds more than that which was harvested in 1953. Canadian growers received \$77,788,000 for this 1954 production, \$18,171,000 more than the previous year. The producers within the Province of Ontario grossed \$74,174,000 compared to \$56,328,000 in 1953.

Flue-cured planted acreage in Ontario in 1954 had been increased to 100 percent of the base acreage from 75 percent in 1953 by agreement with the Flue-Cured Tobacco Marketing Association of Ontario, because of the prospect of increased consumption and exports. The Burley Tobacco Marketing Association of Ontario increased acreage allottments. Dark tobacco acreages were similarly increased.

The overall yield per acre of green-weight leaf tobacco increased to 1,402 pounds in 1954 compared to the 1953 yield of 1,377 pounds per acre. By types, the yield per acre for 1954 together with the respective 1953 yield in brackets, are as follows: Flue-cured, 1,410 (1,382); Burley, 1,431 (1,560); Dark, 1,605 (1,505); Cigar, 1,280 (1,277); and Pipe, 880 (1,045).


