LEAF TOBACCO ACREAGE, PRODUCTION AND VALUE, 1961

(Crop Year Ending September 30, 1961)

An estimated production of leaf tobacco (green weight) in Canada in the crop year ending September 30, 1961 amounted to 209,721,000 pounds, a decrease of approximately 5,000,000 pounds than was harvested in 1960 and, historically, the second largest crop on record. On this basis, the total farm value is estimated at \$105,295,000(4). Prices paid for this crop decreased to 50.21 cents per pound from 137,917 acres while the average yield per acre decreased to 1,521 pounds compared. to 1,575 pounds per acre in 1960.

A crop of 190,164,000 pounds of flue-cured tobacco was grow in Ontario in the current crop year. This volume is comparable to 199,521,000 pounds harvested in the previous year. The average price paid to tobacco producers was 51.70 cents per pound in 1961 compared to 54.56 cents per pound one year earlier. The total farm value, based on the total crop produced, is estimated at \$98,307,000. In 1961 there were 122,270 acres of tobacco harvested in the province, slightly less than 123,831 acres harvested in 1960. It should be noted that there was no tobacco of this type produced in British Columbia in the current year but small acreages were harvested in 1961 in Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Manitoba. From 118 acres in this area, approximately 157,000 pounds of tobacco was realized.

The Burley tobacco commercial harvest in 1961 amounted to 106,516,000 pounds and was produced from 3,681 acres. New varieties planted in the current crop year produced an average yield of 1,770 pounds per acre.


The over-all yield per acre of green weight leaf tobacco decreased from 1575 in 1960 to 1521 pounds in 1961. By types, the yield per acre for 1961, together with the respective 1960 yields in brackets are as follows: flue-cured 1529 (1592); burley 1770 (1200); dark 1312 (1392); cigar 1264 (1303); pipe 977 (1036).


