An estimated production of leaf tobacco (green-weight) in Canada in the crop year ending September 30, 1964 amounted to 153,711,000 pounds, a decrease of approximately 48,000,000 pounds than was harvested in 1963. On this basis the total farm value is estimated at \$83,131,000. Prices paid for this crop increased to 54.08 cents per pound. From 85,316 acres, the average yield per acre increased to 1,802 pounds compared to 1,766 pounds per acre in 1963.

In 1964, reduced acreages in all types of tobacco resulted in decreased production. This general reduction, resulting in the lowest harvested acreage since 1943, was largely influenced by the reduced acreage allotments of flue-cured tobacco in Ontario. The 1964 Ontario crop produced 136,641,000 pounds from 73,479 acres. the latter being approximately 45 per cent of the basic marketable acreage. The Ontario flue-cured crop was about 44 million pounds less than 1963 when slightly over 180,297,000 pounds (green-weight) were realized. The average Ontario price received was 55.63 cents per pound in 1964 compared to 45.81 cents in the former period. The total farm value, based on total crop produced, is estimated at \$83,131,000, some 7 million dollars less than 1963. The farm value per harvested acre in 1964 amounted to \$974 compared to \$796 in the previous year. It should be noted that some 23 million pounds (green-weight basis), of flue-cured tobacco, principally from the 1962 crop, have now been disposed of by the Board.

The Burley tobacco commercial harvest in 1964 amounted to 5,614,000 pounds and was produced from 2,351 acres. Improved varieties planted in the current crop year reflect an increased average yield of 2,360 pounds per acre.

The over-all yield per acre of green-weight leaf tobacco increased from 1,766 in 1963 to 1,802 pounds in 1964. By types, the yield per acre for 1964, together with the respective 1963 yields in brackets are as follows: flue-cured, 1,798 (1,764); burley, 2,341 (2,027); dark, 1,912 (1,588); cigar, 1,500 (1,625); pipe, 1,089 (901).
