## HOPS REPORT

The final estimates of acreage of hops in Canada in 1949 show a reduction in all provinces which, in total, amounted to 10 percent since 1948. Lower acreage yields in British Columbia more than offset slightly higher yields in Quebec and Ontario, with the result that total production was 11 percent below the 1948 level. The average returns to producers amounted to 72 cents per pound or one cent less than was received for the previous crop. The lower price, coupled with a reduced harvest, resulted in a decline of 13 percent in the total value of the crop which was set at \$1,363,000.
