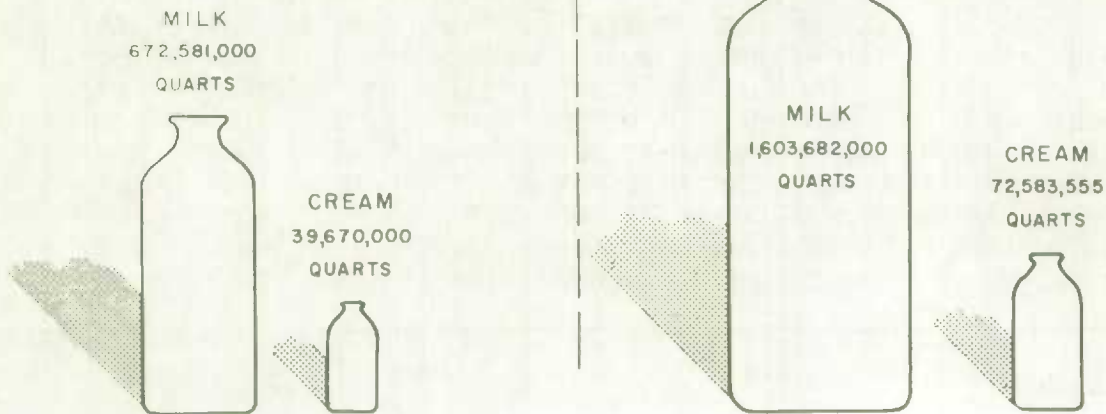
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## FLUID MILK AND CREAM SALES IN CANADA, 1953

## FARM CASH INCOME FROM DAIRYING AND FLUID SALES

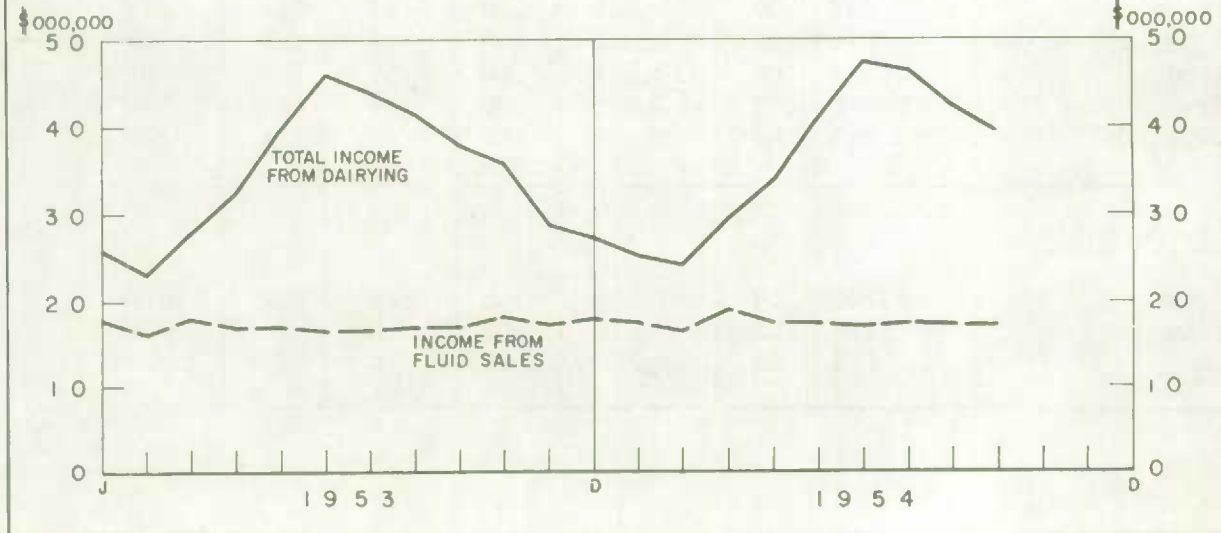
