REPORT ON THE LIVE STOCK SURVEY OF DECEMBER 1, 1952

CATTLE - SHEEP - HORSES

This memorandum contains comparisons of the numbers of cattle, sheep and horses on farms in Canada 1/ at December 1, 1952 and December 1, 1951 2/. These estimates were derived from the December semi-annual survey of live stock on farms by obtaining changes which have occurred on approximately 60,000 farms since the June Survey. The reports were collected and the estimates made with the cooperation of Provincial Departments.

Cattle: The milk cow population (cows and heifers two years old and over kept mainly for milk purposes) in Canada at December 1, 1952 is estimated at 3,019,000, up 6 per cent from the 2,852,600 on farms a year ago. The increase in the five Eastern Provinces was about 8 per cent but this was partially offset by an increase of only 1 per cent in the four Western Provinces. For all cattle and calves, including milk cows, there was a general increase of 12 per cent, the number in Eastern Canada being 14 per cent above last year and in Western Canada 11 per cent. The Manitoba cattle population was virtually unchanged over a year ago.

Totals by provinces (1951 estimates in brackets) were: Prince Edward Island 106,300 (94,100); Nova Scotia 201,000 (171,000); New Brunswick 176,000 (150,100); Quebec 1,633,000 (1,472,000); Ontario 2,949,000 (2,570,000); Manitoba 600,000 (605,500); Saskatchewan 1,271,000 (1,137,000); Alberta 1,660,000 (1,441,000); British Columbia 320,000 (295,800).

Sheep: The number of sheep and lambs on farms in Canada at December 1, 1952 increased by 9 per cent over a year ago. The gain in Eastern Canada was 7 per cent and there was an 11 per cent increase in the West. It would appear that the build-up of flocks which began in 1950 is continuing.

Horses: The number of horses kept on farms again declined, being 1,135,800 at December 1, 1952 as compared with 1,235,300 the previous year. The decrease in the East was about 7 per cent and about 9 per cent in the West. This continues the steady downward trend in numbers which began in 1942.
