## REPORT ON THE LIVE STOCK SURVEY OF JUNE 1, 1954

CATTLE - SHEEP - HORSES

Estimates of the numbers of cattle, sheep and horses on farms in Canada 1/at June 1, 1954 are based on farmers' replies to the annual June sample survey conducted, by mail, in cooperation with Provincial Departments.

Cattle: The upward trend in numbers of cattle on farms, evident since 1951, has almost levelled out with all provinces, except Saskatchewan, registering small increases. The estimate of 9,954,000 cattle and calves was only 2 per cent greater than the estimate for June 1, 1953. The increase in both Eastern Canada and Western Canada was the same at 2 per cent. Cows kept for milking purposes were up nearly 3 per cent from 1953, a decrease having occurred only in Saskatchewan. The number of heifers being kept for milk purposes were down almost 4 per cent from a year ago, with all areas except The Maritimes and British Columbia contributing to this decline. However, for the immediate future, milk production as well as the production of beef and veal should be approximately maintained.

Sheep:- Sheep and lamb numbers have also continued to increase but at a more moderate rate. The increase was about 5 per cent over June 1, 1953 which was caused mainly by the rather sharp increase in Alberta sheep and lamb numbers. The numbers in Eastern Canada increased very slightly and decreased in Manitoba and Saskatchewan.

Horses:- Numbers of horses on farms continue to decline. Estimated at 993,000, the total for Canada was about 9 per cent below that at June 1, 1953.
