REPORT ON LIVESTOCK SURVEYS

CATTLE - SHEEP - HORSES, DECEMBER 1, 1959

CATTLE: The number of cattle and calves on farms in Canada at December 1, 1959 increased almost 4 per cent to 10,489,000 head from the estimate of 10,112,000 at December 1, 1958 and was 1 per cent above the previous record high, of 10,379,000 for December numbers, in 1956. The increase from last year was largely attributable to continued build-up of beef cow numbers and a significantly larger inventory of calves. These classes increased in all provinces. Beef cows, at 2,084,000 were up almost 6 per cent from last year and calves at 3,015,000 head were up 8 per cent to indicate increased holdings on feed and for stocking purposes. The number of milk cows, estimated at 3,072,000, was practically unchanged with increases in Quebec, British Columbia and Ontario slightly more than offsetting decreases in all other provinces. Yearling heifers being raised for milking increased almost 2 per cent to 626,600.

SHEEP: The number of sheep and lambs on farms at December 1, 1959, estimated at 1,188,000 head, was 4 per cent above the corresponding estimate for 1958. Sheep over 1 year old totalled 844,000 as compared with 798,300, while lambs at 344,000 were up only 1,700 from 342,300 at December 1, 1958. While there was a significant decrease of sheep numbers in Quebec there were marked increases of mature sheep in Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Ontario. The number of lambs held over at December 1, was substantially higher in Alberta than last year but was only moderately changed in most provinces.

HORSES: The number of horses on farms decreased about 7 per cent to 593,000.
