REPORT ON LIVESTOCK SURVEYS

CATTLE - SHEEP - HORSES, JUNE 1, 1961

PROPERTY OF THE

The number of cattle and calves on farms in Canada increased over 5 per cent to 12,116,000 head at June 1, 1961, compared with the estimated total of 11,501,000 at June 1, 1960. Increases averaged 7 per cent in Western Canada and 3.5 per cent in the East and occurred in all provinces except New Brunswick. Most of the increase was in beef cattle and calves.

Milk cow numbers increased from 3,162,000 at June 1, 1960 to 3,236,000. Eastern provinces added 59,000 for a 2.5 per cent increase from last year; the West 15,000, or 1.8 per cent. The number of heifers being raised for milking purposes increased fractionally in the East and remained unchanged in the West.

Cows kept mainly for beef purposes increased 6.7 per cent to 417,200 in Eastern Canada and 8 per cent to 1,891,500 in the West. Numbers of beef heifers, steers and calves increased 6.5 per cent, 10.7 per cent, and 5.8 per cent, respectively, with greater average increases in the West than in the East.

SHEET: The total number of sheep and lambs on farms at June 1 is estimated at 1,706,000, down about 4 per cent from June 1, 1960. Decreases in the sheep population were most pronounced in the Maritime Provinces and Quebec. Ontario and Manitoba, with increases of 1 per cent and 7 per cent respectively, were the only provinces for which reports indicated increases in sheep numbers.

HORSES: The number of horses on farms at June 1, estimated at 534,400 head, was about 6 per cent lower than the estimate of 571,500 in 1960. The long-time trend of decreases remained unbroken in all provinces but British Columbia which had a small increase.

The estimates contained in this report are based on farmers' replies to the annual June mail survey conducted by the Agriculture Division of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with Provincial Departments. When census data for June 1, 1961 become available, preliminary annual estimates for the 1956-61 intercensal period will be revised to conform with trends indicated between the censuses of 1956 and 1961. Annual estimates are not available for Newfoundland and the Canada totals shown in this report are nine-province totals only.
