CATTLE - SHEEP - HORSES, DECEMBER 1, 1966

CATTLE: The total number of cattle and calves on farms in Canada (1) at December 1, 1966 is estimated at 11,453,000 down 2 percent from 11,643,000 at December 1, 1965. This figure is only slightly larger than the 1961-65 average of 11,446,700. In the East cattle numbers increased by 1 percent to 5,379,000 with decreases in all provinces except Ontario where numbers increased by 2 percent. Numbers decreased by 4 percent in the West to 6,074,000 with decreases in all four provinces.

Milk cow numbers in Canada decreased 34,000 (1 percent) from December 1, 1965 thus continuing the decline started in 1957. In the East numbers fell by only 4,000 (1 percent) due to a slight increase in Quebec and no change in Ontario. Numbers in the West decreased by 30,000 (5 percent) with all provinces having declines. Yearling milk heifers in Canada dropped by 4 percent to 549,500 down 3 and 5 percent in the East and West respectively.

Numbers of beef cows in Canada decreased by 65,100 (2 percent) from December 1, 1965 with numbers in the East decreasing by 18,100 (4 percent and in the West by 47,000 (2 percent). Beef heifers at 679,600 were down 5 percent from last December. Numbers were up in the East by 2 percent and in the West down by 8 percent. Steers increased by 4 percent to reach a record December high of 1,249,700. The increase of 4 percent was common to both the East and the West.

Calves decreased by 2 percent to 3,329,800.

SHEEP: Total sheep and lamb numbers on farms in Canada (1) at December 1, 1966 are estimated at 754,500 down 1 percent from 765,000 at December 1, 1965. This is the lowest since 1940 when the estimating of sheep numbers at December commenced. Numbers in the East were up by 1 percent and in the West down by 3 percent. All provinces reported decreases except Ontario and Nova Scotia. The basic flock of sheep, one year and over, decreased by 4 percent to 502,200 while lamb numbers were 4 percent higher.

HORSES: The number of horses on farms in Canada (1) at December 1, 1966 is estimated at 362,800 down 8 percent from 396,400 last year. Numbers declined 6 and 10 percent in the East and West, respectively. Decreases occurred in all provinces.
