REPORT ON THE LIVE STOCK SURVEY OF JUNE 1, 1949

SWINE

Ottawa, October \$, 1949: The Dominion Bureau of Statistics today issues the estimates of numbers of hogs on farms in Canada as at June 1 together with estimates on the spring pig crop in 1949 and the number of sows expected to farrow during the fall period of 1949. These estimates are based on returns submitted by farmers and were prepared in cooperation with the Provincial Departments of Agriculture.

Estimated at 5,162,900, the number of hogs on farms in Canada at June 1, 1949 was 16 per cent greater than at June 1, 1948. Increases took place in all provinces except British Columbia. The spring pig crop was 20 per cent larger than in 1948. Breeding intentions reported at the end of May indicate that the higher level of hog production will be maintained with a fall pig crop this year about 17 per cent above that of 1948. Increases are expected to take place in all provinces but Saskatchewan where poor crops in an extensive area for two successive years are among the factors causing reduced production.
