REPORT ON THE LIVE STOCK SURVEY OF JUNE 1, 1954

## HOGS

Estimates of the number of hogs on farms in Canada = as at June 1. 1954. the spring pig crop and the number of sows to farrow during the six month period. June to November, are based on farmers' replies to the June Live Stock Survey. The estimates were prepared in co-operation with provincial Departments of Agriculture.

ilogs on farms at June 1, 1954, estimated at 5,141,000, were 16 per cent above the 4,447,000 at June 1, 1953. Increases occurred in all provinces but Nova Scotia where there was no change. June inventory this year was 19 per cent higher in Western Canada and 13 per cent in the East than last year. Estimates of total numbers by provinces, figures for June 1, 1953 in brackets, are as follows: Prince Edward Island, 70,000 (57,000); Nova Scotia, 39,000 (39,000); New Brunswick, 67,000 (56,000); Quebec, 1,051,000, (867,000); Ontario, 1,560,000 (1,450,000); Total, Eastern Canada, 2,787,000 (2,469,000); Manitoba, 360,000 (287,000); Saskatchewan, 539,000 (469,000); Alberta, 1,408,000 (1,180,000); British Columbia, 47,000 (42,000); Total, Western Canada, 2,354,000 (1,978,000); Total on farms in Canada, not including Newfoundland, 5,141,000 (4,447,000).

The spring pig crop (December, 1953 to May, 1954) with 4,215,000 pigs alive at weaning age was 16 per cent above that of 1953. The increase was 20 per cent in Western Canada and about 11, per cent in Eastern Canada. The number of sows that farrowed during this period, estimated at 577,000 was 9 per cent below the forecast made six months ago on the basis of intentions reported by farmers at December 1. This larger than usual departure from reported intentions may be due in part to the uncertainty in breeding a large proportion of gilts or to a definite cut back in fear of falling prices with heavy marketings this fall.

According to intentions reported by farmers at June 1, it is expected that about 585,000 sows will farrow during the June to November period this year. This is 27 per cent more than the 460,500 sows farrowed for the fall pig crop last year. The increase forecast amounts to 35 per cent in Western Canada and 22 per cent in Eastern Canada.

<sup>1/</sup> Not including Newfoundland for which the latest official data are those of the 1951 Census of Agriculture. At that date there were 1,700 hogs on farms and 1,300 elsewhere than on farms in Newfoundland.
