REPORT ON LIVESTOCK SURVEYS HOGS, SEPTEMBER 1, 1959

The regular quarterly survey of pigs on farms carried out on September 1 sets the number of pigs in Canadal at 7,055,000 head, or 3 per cent above the September 1958 estimate of 6,849,000 head. A pertinent comparison is that of the June 1 estimate in 1959 which was 11 per cent above the June 1958 level. The September 1 pig population on farms in Eastern Canada is estimated at 3,780,000 head, which is 11 per cent higher than a year ago. In the West the estimate of 3,275,000 pigs is 5 per cent below that of September 1, 1958.

The number of summer litters (that is, farrowings from June 1 to August 31) decreased 7 per cent from the 1958 level to an estimated 312,000. Decreases were general except in the Maritime Provinces and British Columbia, with the most drastic cut (20 per cent) occurring in Saskatchewan. The slackening off of farrowing activity was common to both East and West, the decreases being 6 per cent and 7 per cent respectively.

The number of 1959 fall litters (September 1 to November 30 farrowings) may be expected to be just a trifle higher (1 per cent) than in 1958, with decreases in Quebec and Alberta, no change in Manitoba, and moderate increases in other areas.

Information from the June 1 survey had indicated that farrowings from June 1 to November 30 would total 651,000, or 2 per cent more than in 1958. The September survey indicates some modifications of farmers' intentions at June 1, as the net result of the summer and fall farrowings discussed above is a 3 per cent decrease in both Eastern and Western Canada and, of course, for the country as a whole, and the number of farrowings is now expected to be 30,000 during the six months.
