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REPORT ON LIVESTOCK SURVEYS

HOGS, DECEMBER 1, 1960

The number of hogs on farms in Canada at December 1, 1960 is estimated at 5,526,000 head. This is about 14 per cent below the total of 6,417,000 at December 1, 1959. The decrease in eastern Canada was 9 per cent, from 3,437,000 to 3,141,000; but numbers in the west were down 20 per cent, from 2,980,000 to 2,385,000. At June 1, 1960 numbers on farms were 20 per cent lower than at the corresponding period in 1959, with east and west 16 and 25 per cent lower, respectively. While still well below year-earlier totals these relationships indicate that a moderate recovery in hog production has taken place.

The fall pig crop (pigs saved from litters born during the six-month period ending November 30) amounted to 4,150,000 and was 10 per cent less than the fall pig crop in 1959. The spring pig crop in 1960 was 21 per cent below that of 1959.

Hog gradings at inspected and approved plants, as reported by the Canada Department of Agriculture, were 26 per cent lower in the June to November period of 1960 than in 1959. Reduced marketings reflect not only the lower numbers on farms at June 1 but also increasing retention of gilts for breeding.

According to intentions reported by farmers in the December 1960 Survey 636,400 sows are expected to farrow the 1961 spring pig crop. If realized, this would be an increase of 16 per cent from the 548,000 sows farrowed in the December to May period last year.

## - NOTE -

The hog-barley ratio is the number of bushels of No. 1 feed barley required to equal the value of 100 pounds  $B_1$  (live) hogs, both prices at Winnipeg. The long-time average ratio (1913-1949, 1930 omitted due to extreme abnormality) was 18.3. The average ratio 1939-1949 was 20.4 and for 1949 to 1958 it was 19.9.
