REPORT ON LIVESTOCK SURVEYS HOGS, June 1, 1962

The number of hogs on farms in Canada at June 1, 1962 is estimated at 4,973,000. This is a decrease of 6.7 per cent from the 5,331,200 reported in the 1961 Census taken in June. A decrease of 22.5 per cent from last year in the West was partly compensated for by an increase of 8.1 per cent in hog numbers in the East.

The number of sows farrowed for the spring pig crop this year is estimated at 499,600 head, a decrease of 8 per cent from last year. With a slightly higher average in the number of pigs saved per sow farrowed, the spring crop was 6.6 per cent lower than in 1961. The number of pigs saved from spring litters was 10.7 per cent higher than last year in the East, but decreased by almost 27 per cent in the West.

According to reports from farmers at June 1 the number of sows expected to farrow during the six month period, June to December, is 516,300, almost 7 per cent more than the revised estimate of 482,900 sows that farrowed for the fall pig crop in 1961. Reports from Quebec and Ontario indicate a 22 per cent increase from last year for fall farrowings while a decrease of about 12 per cent is expected in the West.

The number of sows that were already bred at June 1 and expected to farrow before September is estimated at 287,000, an increase of almost 13 per cent from the revised estimate of 254,100 that farrowed in the June-August period in 1961.

Revised estimates of the number of hogs on farms at December 1, 1961, based on the new Census benchmarks, are included in this report. The semi-annual estimates for the intercensal period, 1956 to 1961, will be revised to conform to beginning and ending Census data and these revisions will be published at a later date.

Totals shown in this report are for nine provinces only since semiannual farm survey estimates are not available for Newfoundland. The 1961 Census reported 1,554 pigs on farms in Newfoundland.

The hog-barley ratio is the number of bushels of No. 1 feed terley required to equal the value of 100 pounds Grade B (live) hogs, both prices at Winnipeg. The long-time average ratio (1913-1949, 1930 omitted due to extreme abnormality) was 18.3. The average ratio 1939-1949 was 20.4 and for 1951 to 1960 it was 20.0.
