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REPORT ON LIVESTOCK SURVEYS HOCS, SEPTEMBER 1, 1963

The number of hogs on farms in Canada at September 1, 1963 is estimated at 5,520,000, an increase of 4 per cent from the September 1, 1962 total of 5,310,000. All provinces except Nova Scotia showed an increase in the number of hogs on farms compared to year-earlier totals. In the West, where numbers had declined drastically in the fall 1961 and the first helf 1962, the increase of 6 per cent indicates a continuing recovery. The East had a more moderate gain of almost 3 per cent.

The number of sows farrowed in Canada during the summer quarter (June 1 to August 31) was 16 per cent higher than in the corresponding 1962 quarter. Increases occurred in all provinces but were more pronounced in the West with an increase of 23 per cent compared to 11 per cent in Eastern Canada.

Farmers' reports of fall quarter farrowings (September 1 to November 30) indicate that these may be as much as 21 per cent above the 1962 fall farrowings. The increase is greatest in the West where it is 36 per cent as compared with 15 per cent in the Bast.

At June 1 farmers' reports had shown that for Canada as a whole ferrowings from June 1 to November 30, 1963, might total 553,000 or about 16 per cent more than in the corresponding 1962 period. The reports in the September survey reflect a slight upward revision of this figure. Prospective farrowings are now reported in the sample to be 18 per cent higher than in the equivalent period last year. In the West they may be as much as 29 per cent above last year compared to 25 per cent as indicated at June 1. In the East the indicated increase has risen from 11 to 13 per cent.
