REPORT ON LIVESTOCK SURVEYS H O G S, December 1, 1963

The number of hogs on farms in Canada at December 1, 1963 is estimated at 5,348,000 head, about 7 per cent greater than the December 1, 1962 total of 4,993,000. Increases occurred in all provinces except New Brunswick, but were more pronounced in Western Canada where the total increase amounted to 13 per cent compared to 4 per cent for Eastern Canada. Hog production had declined substantially in the West since 1961. Recovery is now taking place there and expansion in Eastern Canada is slowing down.

The fall pig crop (pigs saved from litters born during the six-month period June 1 to November 30) of 4,128,000 was 7.5 per cent larger than that of 3,841,000 in 1962. Increases amounted to 4.2 per cent in the East and 14 per cent in the West. These increases were appreciably less than previously forecast on the basis of the June 1, 1963 survey. Grain marketing developments during the fall are presumed to have had a moderating effect on the expansion of hog production.

Farmers' intentions as reported in the December 1963 survey indicate that about 567,400 sows are expected to farrow in the spring period of 1964, a probable increase of 8.8 per cent over the 521,700 sows farrowed in the December to May period a year ago. Most of the increase is expected in the West where farmers report a possible increase of 20 per cent, compared to an increase of 2.5 per cent in the East.

The hog-barley ratio is the number of bushels of No. 1 feed barley required to equal the value of 100 pounds Grade B (live) hogs, both prices at Winnipeg. The long-time average ratio (1913-1949, 1930 omitted due to extreme abnormality) was 18.3. The average ratio 1939-1949 was 20.4 and for 1951 to 1960 it was 20.0.
