REPORT ON LIVESTOCK SURVEYS HOGS, MARCH 1, 1966

The number of hogs in Canada(1) at March 1, 1966 is estimated at 4,918,000 down 7 per cent from 5,300,000 at March 1, 1965 and down 2.5 per cent from the 5 year-average, 1961-1965 inclusive, of 5,038,000. In Eastern Canada numbers were down by 4 per cent with Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia having increases of 8 and 7 per cent respectively, Ontario unchanged, and New Brunswick and Quebec having decreases of 5 and 13 per cent. Western Canada had 12 per cent lower hog numbers with each province, except Manitoba, having a decrease. Manitoba had a 3 per cent increase whereas Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia had decreases of 18, 14, and 2 per cent respectively.

Sows farrowed in the winter quarter, (December, January, February) are estimated at 258,500 up 10 per cent from the 235,000 that farrowed in the same quarter of 1965. Farmers' reports at March 1 indicate that sows to farrow in the spring quarter (March, April, May) may be as high as 353,000 up 27 per cent from the 278,200 that farrowed in the same quarter of 1965. If these intentions are realized then the sows to farrow in the period December 1, 1965 to May 31, 1966 would be 611,500 up 19 per cent from 513,200 farrowings in the corresponding 6 months of 1965 and 16 per cent above the 5 year (1961-1965 inclusive) average of 523,700 for spring farrowings. At December 1, 1965 the indications were for a 10 per cent increase but the March reports show a marked upward revision in farrowing plans.

(1) Not including Newfoundland. The June 1, 1961 census reported 1,554 hogs in that province at that time. Hogs 6 months old and over 450, and those under 6 months old were 1,104.
