## REPORT ON THE POULTRY SURVEY OF JUNE 1, 1953

Ottawa, September 4, 1953: The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issued today estimates of the number of poultry on farms in Canada  $\frac{1}{4}$  as at June 1, 1953. The estimates are based on reports from farmers and were prepared in cooperation with provincial officials.

The estimated total number of poultry on farms at June 1, 1953 was 66,451,000 birds, an increase of 1 percent from that reported by the June 1 survey at the same date in 1952. This total is composed of 62,960,000 domestic fowl (hens, cocks and chickens), 2,615,000 turkeys, 388,000 geese and 488,000 ducks.

The estimated number of domestic fowl increased by 2 percent from June 1, 1952. By classes the numbers (with the 1952 estimates in brackets), were; hens and pullets over 6 weeks 38,699,000 (37,987,000) cocks and cockerels over 6 weeks 8,322,000 (7,943,000), and chickens under 6 weeks 15,909,000 (15,802,000). The seasonal peak in hatching appears to have been slightly later than last year and the small increase in numbers at June 1, is in young birds.

The estimated number of turkeys at 2,615,000 showed a decrease of 17 percent from last year. This is in contrast to the large increase shown last year. During the same period geese increased 1 percent and ducks decreased 2 percent.

1/ Current estimates for Newfoundland are not available. The census of June 1, 1951 reports 76,429 head of poultry. By classes the number reported was: domestic fowl 73,714, turkeys 1,553, geese 548 and ducks 614.
