## REPORT ON THE POULTRY SURVEY OF JUNE 1, 1954

Estimates of the number of poultry on farms in Canada 1/ at June 1 are based on farmer's replies on a semi-annual mail survey questionaire and were prepared in cooperation with provincial officials.

The total number of poultry on farms at June 1, 1954 is estimated at 71.695.000 birds, an increase of almost of 8 per cent from the estimate of 66,451,000 birds on farms at June 1, 1953. Total hens and chickens increased 7.4 per cent to 67,609,000 with gains in all provinces. Turkeys at 3,230,000 were 24 per cent above 1953 numbers at June 1 and increased in all provinces except Prince Edward Island while geese decreased 6 per cent in total to 366,000 with Manitoba and Quebec showing a small gain. The number of ducks at 490,000 total for all provinces shows no significant change from 488,000 at June 1, 1953, with decreases in Ontario, Saskatchewan and British Columbia being offset by increases in Quebec, Manitoba and Alberta.

Estimates for hens and chickens by age and sex groups at June 1, (1953 figures in brackets) are: hens and pullets over 6 months old, 21,235,000 (20,695,000); pullets 6 weeks to 6 months old, 19,376,000 (17,034,000); cocks and cockerels over 6 weeks old, 8,844,000 (7,922,000); chicks up to 6 weeks old, 18,154,000 (17,309,000).

The estimates, by provinces, for hens and pullets over 6 months old which comprise the laying flock except for pullets under 6 months that had already started to lay are as follows: Prince Edward Island, 445,000 (415,000); Nova Scotia, 710,000 (700,000); New Brunswick, 480,000 (460,000) Quebec, 3,650,000 (3,300,000); Ontario, 7,300,000 (7,200,000); Manitoba, 2,000,000 (2,050,000); Saskatchewan, 2.500,000 (2.690,000); Alberta, 2.650,000 (2.600,000); British Columbia, 1,500,000 (1,280,000).

<sup>1/</sup> Current estimates for Newfoundland are not available. The census of June 1, 1951 reports 76,429 head of poultry on farms. By classes the number reported was: hens and chickens 73,714, turkeys 1,553, geese 548 and ducks 614. Elsewhere than on farms there were 206,167 hens and chickens and 9,074 other poultry.
