REPORT ON THE POULTRY SURVEY OF JUNE 1. 1961

The total of all poultry on farms in Canada 1/ at June 1, 1961, estimated at 79.1 million birds, was 5 per cent higher than at June 1, 1960 when the comparable total was 75.6 million birds. The estimate for June 1, 1961 includes 70,780,000 hens and chickens; 7,697,000 turkeys, 264,000 geese and 391,000 ducks.

The estimate of 70.8 million hens and chickens is 3 per cent higher than the June 1960 estimate of 68.8 million. This increase occurred because a sizeable rise in the number of chicks more than offset the declines registered for the other categories of hens and chickens. The classifications of hens and chickens as reported in this year's survey are not quite the same as in previous years and, therefore, data for some categories are not fully comparable with previous estimates. Questions were altered to conform with the 1961 Census of Agriculture schedule.

The rise in the number of chicks under two months old occurred because more chicks were placed on farms in April and May than during the same months last year. Although 4.9 per cent fewer laying type chicks were placed in April and May than in 1960 there was a 37.0 per cent increase in broiler chick placements.

As the result of a substantial increase in turkey poult placements there were 25 per cent more turkeys on farms at June 1, 1961 compared to June 1, 1960. The number of geese was lower than last year while there were a few more ducks on farms than a year ago. Changes in the number of geese and ducks on farms are not directly related to changes in production as the proportion hatched after June 1 varies from year to year.

Estimates of poultry numbers on farms are based on semi-annual mailed questionnaire surveys conducted in co-operation with Provincial Government Departments at June 1 and December 1 and on hatchery statistics compiled by the Canada Department of Agriculture. The semi-annual estimates of poultry numbers provide a basis for monthly estimates of number of layers and egg production. Revised monthly estimates of egg production for the period January-June will appear in the July report 'Production of Eggs', Catalogue Number 23-003.

1/ Current estimates for Newfoundland are not available. The Census of June 1, 1956 reports 108,707 head of poultry on farms. By class, the number reported was: hens and chickens, 105,783; turkeys, 2,084; geese, 307; ducks,533. Elsewhere than farms there were 180,041 hens and chickens and 2,910 other poultry.
