HONEY CROP REPORT

Ottawa, February 19, 1947- The Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Dominion and Provincial Departments of Agriculture issues today preliminary estimates of honey production in Canada in 1946.

SUMMARY

Honey production in 1946 dropped sharply to 23,975,000 pounds, a decline of about 9,000,000 pounds from the previous crop. Not since 1929 has production been at this low level. Alberta, British Columbia and New Brunswick are the only provinces where production was higher than in 1945. The small crop in Eastern Canada was the result of very dry weather during July and August. The decline in Saskatchewan, on the other hand, was due to heavy frosts during July which reduced the flow of nectar from the alfalfa. Prices this year reflect the sharp drop in production and the average for Canada is 2 cents higher at 18 cents. Prices range from 16 cents per pound in Alberta to 25 cents per pound in New Brunswick. The total value of the crop is currently estimated at \$4,315,000, a decline of 21 percent from the value of the previous crop.
