## HONEY CROP REPORT

Ottawa, August 25, 1947 - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Dominion and Provincial Departments of Agriculture issues today preliminary estimates of honey production in Canada in 1947.

## SUMMARY

According to a survey recently completed, 41,862,000 pounds of honey will be produced in Canada this season. This estimate includes both light and dark honey and is based on the condition of the colonies during the second and third weeks of August. Much larger crops than in 1946 are expected in all Provinces but the greatest improvement is shown in Eastern Canada. Last season, due to unfavourable weather, especially in Ontario and Quebec, the crop was the smallest in a good many years. Early reports this season were not encouraging, particularly in view of the late arrival of many of the package bees from the Southern United States. As the season progressed, conditions improved and production by Province is now estimated as follows: - Prince Edward Island 78,000 lb; Nova Scotia 152,000 lb; New Brunswick 226,000 lb; Quebec 6,124,000 lb; Ontario 13,598,000 lb; Manitoba 7,732,000 lb; Saskatchewan 5,802,000; Alberta 6,820,000 lb; British Columbia 1,330,000.
