ESTIMATED VALUE OF HONEY PRODUCTION, 1962

The revised estimate of the 1962 honey crop stands at 30.7 million pounds, 12 per cent below the 1961 crop of 35.0 million pounds, but 7 per cent above the 1950-59 average of 28.7 million pounds. The drop in production from 1961 was due entirely to a lower average yield per colony as the total number of colonies operated showed an increase from the previous season. The increase in honey production in 1962 from the 1950-59 period, however, was due to a higher average yield, with colony numbers being somewhat below the average for the earlier period.

The total value of the honey produced in Canada in 1962 is estimated at 5.3 million dollars, a drop of about 5 per cent from the value of the 1961 crop. These figures represent total returns for honey received by beekeepers, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, not including the cost of containers. Beekeepers replying to the second honey survey of the 1962 crop, which was conducted in the early part of 1963, were asked to indicate the average price received for their honey. In the case of beekeepers patronizing co-operatives, final payments to the individual producers were not known at the time this survey was made. Therefore, co-operative establishments handling honey in Canada were asked to prepare estimates of the volume and value of honey which they expected to handle and the average returns which they anticipated paying their patrons by the end of the season. Final figures will be obtained at a later date. This information was used in calculating the weighted average price for the provinces concerned. To the extent that such returns are estimates, the 1962 prices are preliminary and subject to revision.

The 1960 and 1961 estimates of farm value of honey include deficiency payments to elegible producers made by the Agricultural Stabalization Board up to August 31, 1963.

Source: Estimates for the Province of Quebec are prepared by the Bureau of Statistics, Department of Trade and Commerce, of that province. For all other provinces except Newfoundland, for which data are not available, the estimates are prepared by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the provinces. Three mail questionnaire surveys are conducted, one in July to obtain the number of colonies and another in September to determine yields. A final yield and price survey is conducted at about the end of the year. Provincial officials provide the mailing lists of beekeepers and aid in the interpretation of survey results.
