THE 1944 HONEY CROP

Ottawa, October 11, 1944.- The Dominion Bureau of Statistics in cooperation with the Dominion and Provincial Departments of Agricultures issues today a report on honey production in Canada in 1944.

SUMMARY

According to the preliminary estimate of production the honey crop this season amounts to 36,215,800 pounds. This year's output is 3,276,300 pounds or 8 per cent smaller than the very large crop of 39,492,100 pounds produced in 1943, but is 8 per cent greater than the ten-year 1933-42 average of 33,462,000 pounds.

The yields per colony were higher this season than in 1943 in only two provinces, namely, Manitoba and Alberta, where the average was 100 pounds and 105 pounds respectively. In the other 7 provinces the average yields ranged from a low of 37 pounds in Quebec to 95 pounds in Saskatchewan. With the exception of Ontario, increases in the number of producing colonies are reported in all provinces, the greatest increase being in Prince Edward Island where the number is 60 per cent larger than in 1943. In Ontario the number of producing colonies remained unchanged. Normally, about 50 per cent of the crop is produced in Ontario, but this year because of unfavourable weather conditions, the Ontario crop amounted to 39 per cent of the Canadian total.

The summer flow of nectar was a little above normal in Manitoba and about normal in Prince Edward Island and Saskatchewan. In all other provinces the flow was well below normal. Approximately 91 per cent or 32,898,000 pounds was 'light' honey with the remaining 9 per cent grading 'dark'.


