CANADIAN WOOL PRODUCTION

Ottawa, November 6, 1941.- The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues today a preliminary estimate of shorn wool production for 1941. This estimate has been based upon returns from wool growers in all provinces.

Production of shorn wool in Canada reached a new peak in 1941. The preliminary estimate for the Dominion is 14,511,000 pounds as compared with an estimate of 13,822,000 pounds in 1940 and the previous high of 14,027,000 pounds in 1932. The number of sheep shorn in 1941 is estimated at 1,925,300 with an average yield per fleece of 7.5 pounds compared with shearings of 1,830,500 sheep in 1940 and an average yield per fleece of 7.4 pounds. The number of sheep shorn showed an increase in 1941 in all provinces except Nova Scotia, Ontario and British Columbia.

Correspondents reported that 85 per cent of the 1941 clip had been sold or consigned for sale up to the end of June. The amount intended for use on farms was reported to be 3.5 per cent of the total leaving 11.5 per cent of the clip still in farmers' hands.
