SHORN WOOL FRODUCTION IN CANADA - 1951

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The Dominion Bureau of Statistics today issued the 1951 estimates of shorn wool production. With slightly less than 1 million sheep shorn in Canada this spring, total production is estimated to be 7,471,000 pounds. This is $5\frac{1}{2}$ per cent lower than the 1950 estimate of 7,904,000 pounds. The national average weight per fleece was 7.8 pounds, (7.7 pounds in 1950), but with reduced numbers of sheep on hand the total clip was less than last year, and one of the lowest on record.

Production in the Maritime Provinces and in the Prairie Provinces was practically unchanged from the previous year, but both Ontario and Quebec recorded substantial decreases.
