## WOOL PRODUCTION

Ottawa, March 1, 1945. The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues to day a report giving the estimates of shorn and pulled wool production, exports, imports and apparent consumption for 1944, the gross income from wool and the cash income from sales of wool off farms.

## SUMMARY

Total wool production in Canada in 1944 amounted to 19,279,000 pounds, an increase of 1,461,000 pounds over that of 1943. Increases in the numbers of sheep on farms in all provinces except Manitoba and Nova Scotia were responsible for the increased production of shorn wool. Increased slaughterings of sheep and lambs resulted in an increase in the production of pulled wool. The apparent consumption of wool in Canada was sharply lower in 1944 as compared with that of the three preceding years but as figures of stocks of wool in storage are not available, the figures of actual consumption in any individual year may be quite different from the apparent disappearance. The greater production of shorn wool resulted in a higher gross value of production and a corresponding increase in the cash income to producers. Cash income from the sale of wool in 1944 amounted to \$3,767,000.
