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## WOOL PRODUCTION AND SUIFLY - 1950

Ottawa, March 3, 1951: Wool production in Canada, not including Newfoundland, during 1950, amounted to 9,237,000 pounds, a decrease of about 6 per cent from the previous year. The 1950 production was the lowest recorded and amounted to about 58 per cent of the average annual production of the 1935-39 period. There was a slight increase in shorn wool production due to an increase in average fleece weight. The reduction in total production, therefore, was due to a decrease in production of pulled wool. Pulleries reported a recovery of only 1,333,000 pounds in 1950 as against 2,076,000 pounds in 1949, a drop of approximately 36 per cent. This sharp decline can be accounted for in part by a 17 per cent decrease in inspected slaughter of sheep and lambs and a slight increase in the number of skins exported.

Exports of wool in 1950 totalled 4,328,000 pounds in comparison with 3,920,000 pounds in the previous year. Imports of wool in 1950 amounted to 82,241,000 pounds, an increase of about 11.5 million pounds over 1949 and 29.4 million pounds more than the average for the 5-year period 1935-39. Because data on wool inventories are not available, total domestic use cannot be calculated precisely. Assuming no change in stocks, the domestic disappearance was 87,150,000 pounds in 1950 as compared with 76,635,000 pounds in 1949.
