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WOOL PRODUCTION AND SUPPLY -

Wool production in Canada during 1952 amounted to 7,691,000 pounds, an increase of nearly 12 per cent over the revised2/figure for 1951. An increase in sheep numbers was reflected in increases in both shorn and pulled wool. Due to a sharp drop in average prices in 1952, the total value of the shorn-wool crop was only \$2,265,000 as against \$4,231,000 in 1951.

Exports of wool in 1952 totalled 3,639,000 pounds in comparison with 2,656,000 pounds in the previous year, and imports amounted to 49,537,000 pounds as against 69.012.000 pounds. Because data on wool inventories are not available, total domestic use cannot be calculated precisely. Assuming no change in stocks, the domestic disappearance was 53,589,000 pounds in 1952 as compared with 73,238,000 pounds in 1951.

Figures of shorn-wool production are currently being revised, and, pending completion of the revisions, data for the years previous to 1951 have been omitted in the table below.
