WOOL PRODUCTION AND SUPPLY 1 9 6 0

Wool production in Canada in 1960, estimated at 8,278,000 pounds, was about the same as in 1959. Output of shorn wool was 91,000 pounds greater than in 1959 but the recovery of pulled wool was 100,000 pounds less at 6,891,000 and 1,387,000 pounds, respectively.

Imports of wool at 49,502,000 pounds were about six times the total amount produced in Canada. Imports were almost 2 million pounds less than in 1959. Exports of Canadian wool declined about 1,300,000 pounds to 3,678,000 pounds. Apparent domestic diseppearance of wool in Canada therefore decreased slightly in 1960 to 54,102,000 pounds from 54,777,000 pounds in 1959.

Total farm value of shorn wool production in 1960 was \$3,168,000. This included deficiency payments of 23 cents per pound made under the Agricultural Stabilization Act on qualifying grades. Average farm values before deficiency payments increased from 27.1 cents per pound in 1959 to 28.0 cents per pound in 1960.
