WOOL PRODUCTION AND SUPPLY 1 9 6 1

Wool production in Canada in 1961, estimated at 8,032,000 pounds, was about 3 per cent less than in 1960. Output of shorn wool at 6,745,000 pounds and pulled wool at 1,287,000 pounds declined 146,000 and 100,000 pounds, respectively, from last year.

Imports of wool, amounting to 54,430,000 pounds, greasy basis, were about 10 per cent greater than in 1960. Exports totalled 5,067,000 pounds. Apparent domestic disappearance of wool in Canada, not adjusted for stock changes, was 57,395,000 pounds in 1961 compared to 54,102,000 in 1960.

The preliminary estimate of the farm value of shorn wool production in 1961 is \$3,255,000. This includes deficiency payments to the end of March 1962 at the rate of 22 cents per pound made under the Agricultural Stabilization Act on qualifying grades of wool. Average farm values without deficiency payments increased from 28.0 cents per pound in 1960 to 30.5 cents per pound in 1961.
