WOOL PRODUCTION AND SUPPLY 1962

Wool production in Canada in 1962, estimated at 7,169,000 pounds, was almost 4 per cent less than in 1961. Output of shorn wool declined from 6,169,000 pounds to 5,808,000 while pulled wool was up slightly from 1,287,000 in 1961 to 1,361,000 pounds in 1962.

Imports of wool, at 54,308,000 pounds, greasy basis, were about the same as in 1961 but exports fell from 5,067,000 to 3,972,000 pounds. Apparent domestic disappearance at 57,505,000 pounds was the highest since 1956.

The preliminary estimate of the farm value of shorn wool production in 1962 is \$2,833,000. This includes deficiency payments made to farmers under the Agricultural Stabilization Act on the basis of 18.26 cents per pound for qualifying grades or wool. Average farm value, not including deficiency payments, increased to 32.7 cents per pound in 1962 from 30.5 cents in 1961.
