## WOOL PRODUCTION AND SUPPLY 1 9 6 3

Wool production in Canada\* in 1963, estimated at 6,812,000 pounds, was 5 per cent less than in 1962. Shorn wool output declined from 5,808,000 pounds to 5,259,000 pounds whereas pulled wool production increased from 1,361,000 pounds in 1962 to 1,553,000 pounds in 1963.

Imports of wool were 59,805,000 pounds which is an increase of about 10 per cent over 1962. Exports also increased from 3,972,000 pounds in 1962 to 4,661,000 pounds in 1963. Apparent domestic disappearance at 61,956,000 pounds was the highest since 1953.

The preliminary estimate of the farm value of shorn wool production in 1963 is \$2,670,000. This includes deficiency payments made to farmers under the Agricultural Stabilization Act on the basis of 14.30 cents per pound for qualifying grades of wool. Average farm value, not including deficiency payments, increased to 38.7 cents per pound in 1963 from 32.7 cents in 1962.
