THE ANTICIPATED PELT PRODUCTION OF FUR FARMS, CANADA, SEASON 1941-42

The present report, issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Federal Department of Agriculture, contains estimates of the numbers of silver and new type fox and mink pelts from fur farms which will be available for the marketing season of 1941-42. The information is based on returns from the fur farmers, under a sample census plan, which was taken by the following method: from the list of fur farmers, every fifth name was selected, and to each of these addresses was dispatched a form asking for the anticipated pelt production of the farm, and other data. About 1,800 fur farmers were circularized, and replies were received from 96 per cent. The returns were then compiled and the statement thus obtained was multiplied by 5.16. The resulting data are given below.
