## THE ANTICIPATIRD PELT PRODUCTION OF FUR FARMS, CANADA, SRASON 1951-52

Ottawa, September 5, 1951: The number of pelts of standard silver and new type foxes to be taken from fur farms in Canada for the 1951-52 season is estimated at 41,800. Standard and mutation mink pelts are estimated to be 526,200. These estimates are based on a sample return from fox and mink farms.

It is estimated that 33,900 of the foxes to be pelted will be standard silver and 7,900 new type, while in mink there will be 375,400 standard, 77,500 silverblu, 55,300 pastel and 18,000 other matations, a decrease of 19.6 per cent in fox pelts and a increase of 2.1 per cent in mink from the 1950-51 season. The estimates indicate a decresse of 18.9 per cent in adult foxes on farms at the beginning of 1951 as compared with January 1, 1950. Adult mink on farms increased 3.3 per cent during the same period. The estimated number of fox pups raised in 1951 is 20.0 per cent less than last year but the number of mink kits increased by 1.9 per cent.
