THE ANTICIPATED PELT PRODUCTION OF FUR FARMS, CANADA 1/ SEASON 1953-54

Ottawa, September 4, 1953: The number of pelts of standard silver and new type foxes to be taken from fur farms in Canada for the 1953-54 season is estimated at 12,700. Standard and mutation mink pelts are estimated to be 623,200. These estimates are based on a sample return from fox and mink farms.

It is estimated that 8,500 of the foxes to be pelted will be standard silver and 4,200 new type, while in mink there will be 329,700 standard, 109,100 silverblu, 117,100 pastel and 67,300 other mutations, a decrease of 46.4 per cent in fox pelts and 15.2 per cent increase in mink from the 1952-53 season. The estimates indicate a decrease of 37.8 per cent in adult foxes on farms at the beginning of 1953 as compared with January 1, 1952. Adult mink on farms increased 30.4 per cent during the same period. The estimated number of fox pups raised in 1953 is 42.6 per cent less than last year and the number of mink kits increased by 17.0 per cent.
