THE ANTICIPATED PELT PRODUCTION OF FUR FARMS, CANADA

SEASON 1954-55

The forecast of pelt production in Canada $\frac{1}{2}$ from ranch raised fox and mink in the 1954-55 season is 6,800 fox and 758,600 mink pelts. These estimates are derived from a sample return from fur ranchers indicating their intentions at July 1.

It is estimated that 4,400 standard silver and 2,400 new type fox pelts will be taken from fur farm animals this season, a sharp decline from last year's total of about 12,700 pelts.

Indications are for a 12 per cent increase in mink pelts this season, the result of a sharp increase in the number of pastel and other mutations and a moderate increase in silverblu mink pelts. The number of standard mink pelts will be down about 22 per cent from last season. It is expected there will be 257,600 standard, 139,300 silverblu, 204,600 pastel and 94,800 other mutation mink pelts.
