THE ANTICIPATED PELT PRODUCTION ON FUR FAIMS, CANABA ARY

SEASON 1955-56

The forecast of pelt production in Canada 1/ from ranch-raised fox and mink in the 1955-56 season is 6,200 fox and 784,900 mink pelts. These estimates are based on a sample return from fur ranchers indicating their intentions with regard to peltings for the coming season.

It is estimated that there will be 3,900 standard silver and 2,300 new-type fox pelts from fur-farm animals which is a slight decline from last year's total of 6,800 fox pelts.

Mink peltings indicated will be 13 per cent higher than in the previous season. Standard pelts are expected to be increased by 5 per cent, silverblu by 1 per cent, pastel by 20 per cent, and other mutation mink by 39 per cent. A total of 784,900 mink pelts is forecast.
