THE AUTICIPATED PELT PRODUCTION ON FUR FARMS, CAYADA 1/ SEASON 1956-57

The forecast of pelt production from ranch-raised fox and mink in Canada  $\frac{1}{2}$  during the 1956-57 season is 4,000 fox and 849,000 mink pelts. These estimates are based on a sample survey in which fur farmers report pelting intentions.

Fox peltings, still declining, are expected to consist of 2,000 silver and 2,000 new-type, more than a third below the preliminary estimate of 5,200 in total last year. Indications are that 849,000 mink will be pelted. This is an 8 per cent increase on the preliminary estimate of 784,900 for last season. Standard mink peltings are expected to decrease 3 per cent and silverblu by 22 per cent, while increases of 22 and 39 per cent are expected in the take of pastel and other mutation pelts, respectively.
