

THE ANTICIPATED PELT PRODUCTION ON FUR FARMS, CANADA SEASON 1957-58

The pre-season sample survey in which fur farmers report pelting intentions indicates that pelt production from ranch-raised fox and mink during the 1957-58 season will consist of about 1,300 fox and 794,000 mink pelts.

The number of foxes on hand at the beginning of 1957 was drastically reduced to about 43 per cent of holdings a year earlier and peltings are expected to consist of about 800 silver and 500 other mutation types, approximately one-third of last season's peltings.

Mink on farms at the beginning of 1957 slightly exceeded year earlier totals and a very marked shift from standard to mutation mink has occurred. The number of kits raised per female was lower than last year in nearly all provinces and the estimate of total mink peltings indicates a decrease of about 6.5 per cent from last season. The expected take of standard mink pelts at 109,300 is only 42 per cent of the estimate for the previous season but mutation peltings are expected to increase about 17 per cent to 684,700.
