PRODUCTION OF CONCENTRATED MILK, CANADA, OCTOBER, 1937.

Statistics of the production of concentrated milk in Canada in October, 1937, are based on returns from the 41 firms whose factories manufactured during the month, any of the various items embraced in the classification "concentrated milk", i.e., condensed milk, evaporated milk, milk powder, etc.

Production.- Continuing the high record for 1937, the production of concentrated milk in October amounted to 14,787,265 pounds, an increase over October, 1936, of 5,242,356 pounds, or 55 per cent. The amount of evaporated milk made was nearly double that of October of last year, while condensed milk and skim milk powder also record increases.

Cumulative Production.- Combining all items the total production for the ten months ended October 31, was 132,520,029 pounds, compared with 95,262,708 pounds in the corresponding period of 1936. The amount for the first ten months of this year constitutes a high record for similar periods in the eight years for which monthly statistics are available.

Foreign Trade.- A slight increase over October, 1936, is shown in the exports of concentrated milk in October of this year. The principal countries of destination for evaporated milk are the United Kingdom, Newfoundland and Straits Settlements; for milk powder, the United Kingdom, Venezuela, the United States, Belgian Congo and Straits Settlements; and for condensed milk, Newfoundland and Jamaica.

Import figures for October are not available at date of the preparation of this report.

Storage Holdings.- The combined total for all items of concentrated milk held in storage at date of November 1 was 15,447,228 pounds, a decrease from the preceding month of 2,966,409 pounds, but an increase over November 1, 1936, of 1,578,673 pounds. The holdings of evaporated milk at date of November 1 of the present year represent 79 per cent of the total holdings for all items of concentrated milk.
