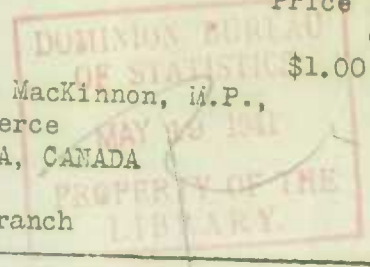

PRODUCTION OF CONCENTRATED MILK, CANADA, APRIL, 1941

Statistics of the production of concentrated milk in Canada in April, 1941, are based on returns from the 57 firms whose factories manufactured during the month any of the various items embraced in the classification of "concentrated milk", i.e., condensed whole milk and condensed skim milk, evaporated whole milk and evaporated skim milk, whole milk powder and skim milk powder, etc.

Production.- The combined output of all items of concentrated whole milk and by-products during the month of April was 22,107,178 pounds, an increase over April, 1940, of 5,235,626 pounds or 31 per cent. Evaporated whole milk increased by 35 per cent; condensed whole milk by 91 per cent, and skim milk powder by 4 per cent.

Cumulative Production.- Canada's production of concentrated whole milk and by-products in the four months ended April 30 was 62,626,256 pounds, compared with 48,522,228 pounds in the corresponding period of 1940.

Foreign Trade.- The exports of concentrated milk during the month of April aggregated 3,657,200, compared with 1,885,200 pounds in April, 1940. Import figures for April are not available at date of the preparation of this report.

Stocks.- The total holdings at date of May 1, for all items combined was 7,414,095 pounds, compared with 6,930,012 pounds at the beginning of the preceding month and 16,550,762 pounds at date of May 1, 1940.

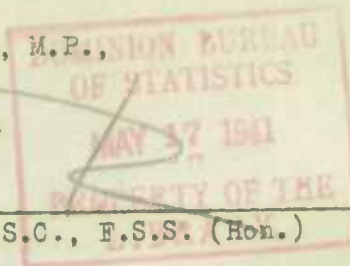
