PRODUCTION OF CONCENTRATED MILK, CANADA, JULY, 1941.

Statistics of the production of concentrated milk in Canada in July, 1941, are based on returns from the 58 firms whose factories manufactured during the month any of the various items embraced in the classification of "concentrated milk", i.e., condensed whole milk and condensed skim milk, evaporated whole milk and evaporated skim milk, whole milk powder and skim milk powder, etc.

Production. - The quantity of concentrated whole milk and by-products (including all items) manufactured during the month of July amounted to 26,974,684 pounds, compared with 22,733,294 pounds in July, 1940, and 19,184,948 pounds in July, 1939. Comprised in the total for July of the present year are 22,613,152 pounds in the classification of whole milk products, and 4,361,532 pounds in that of by-products. The former classification shows an increase over July, 1940, of 4,268,224 pounds, or 23 per cent, and the latter a decrease of 26,834 pounds, or 1 per cent.

Cumulative Production. - For the seven months ended July 31 the output of concentrated whole milk and by-products totalled 148,109,412 pounds, compared with 118,491,708 pounds in the corresponding period of 1940 and with 94,940,192 pounds in the period of 1939.

Foreign Trade. - The exports in July amounted to 8,837,200 pounds, against a total of 4,318,900 pounds in July, 1940. The import figures are not available at date of the preparation of this report.

Stocks. - Concentrated whole milk products and by-products held in storage at date of August 1 amounted to 26,789,366 pounds, compared with 33,410,799 pounds at the beginning of August, 1940.

Factory Sales of Milk Powders. - Commencing with the present issue, the statement on the factory sales of the various kinds of milk powders, which was formerly published separately, will be included with the report on the production of concentrated milk. See page 3.
