PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE FUR FARMS OF CANADA, 1927

<u>Number of Farms</u>:- The number of fur farms in operation in Canada in 1927 was 3,360, an increase of 671 over the preceding year. The number of farms classified as fox furms in 1927 was 3,067, an increase of 544 over the number recorded in 1926. The mink farms numbered 163, an increase of 68, and the **rac**coon farms, 111, an increase of 53. Other kinds of fur farms in operation in 1927 comprised skunk, marten, fisher, coyote, rabbit, and karakul sheep. There were also in operation 172 muskrat farms, in comparison with 107 in 1926, information regarding which is not included in the statistics of the present report, as the operators of the farms were unable to furnish particulars similar to those supplied by operators of other kinds of fur farms, such as number of fur bearing animals on the farm, number born, died, etc.

Value of Property:- The total value of property, comprising fur-bearing animals on the farm at the end of the year, and the land and buildings, was \$18,355,423, an increase over the preceding year of \$3,389,238 or 23 p.c. The value of the furbearing animals accounted for \$13,465,882 of the total in 1927, and the value of the land and buildings, \$4,889,541. Prince Edward Island occupies first place in the industry in order of value of property, with a total of \$4,678,289, an increase over the preceding year of \$372,963, or $8\frac{1}{2}$ p.c. Ontario is second with \$3,562,204, an increase of \$786,052, or 25 p.c., and Quebec third with \$3,098,573, an increase of \$692,668, or 40 p.c.

Number of Fur-bearing Animals Born, Died and Killed for Pelts:- The number of fur-bearing animals born in captivity during the year 1927 was 58,542. Silver fox heads the list with a total of 45,750. The number of patch foxes born was 1,429, of red foxes, 1,066, and of blue foxes, 1,313. The number of mink born was 1,995. With the exception of Chinchilla and other kinds of rabbit, the mink is second to silver fox in the number of animals born during the year. All kinds of fur-bearing animals show increases over the preceding year in number born, excepting skunk, marten and Siberian here, for which decreases are recorded. The total increase over the preceding year in the number of animals which died during the year was 13,241, comprising 10,064 silver foxes, and 3,157 other kinds of fur-bearing animals. The final report on the fur farming industry for 1927 will contain particulars regarding the various causes of death. The number of furbearing animals killed for pelts was 25,558, an increase over the preceding year of 5,120, or 25 p.c. Of the total number killed for pelts, the silver fox accounts for 20,890, or 82 p.c.

<u>Fur-bearing Animals Soldi-</u> The records show that 16,382 fur-bearing animals, valued at \$2,644,062 were sold from fur farms in 1927, an increase ovor the preceding year of 2,118 in number and of \$349,433 in value. Silver fox is of chief importance, with a total of 12,804 animals, valued at \$2,501,816, an average value of \$195 per fox. Compared with the proceeding year, the total number of silver foxes sold show an increase of 2,290, the total value an increase of \$312,486, and the average value per fox, a decrease of \$13. Average values were higher than in 1926 for red fox, blue fox, mink, skunk, marton, Siberian hare, rabbit, and Karakul sheep, and lower for silver fox, patch or cross fox, raccoon and fisher.

Pelts Sold!- The number of pelts sold from fur farms during the year also shows an increase over 1926. The total number sold in 1927 was 25,018, and the total value \$2,154,080, compared with 16,732, valued at \$1,224,941 in 1926. The number of silver fox pelts sold was 21,128, an increase over the proceeding year of 7,007, the total value \$2,066,900, an increase of \$892,200, and the average value per pelt, \$98, an increase of \$15. In 1926 the records show only 1 blue fox pelt disposed of, while in 1927 there were 182 blue fox pelts sold with a value of \$8,053, and an average value per pelt of \$44. The number of mink pelts was double that of the preceding year, while the average value was the same. The number of raccoon pelts sold was 168, compared with 51 in 1926. Increases in number of pelts are shown for all kinds, excepting patch or cross fox, skuhk and coyote.

<u>Total Revenue</u>:- The total revenue to the fur farmers in 1927 from the sale of live fur-bearing animals and of pelts was \$4,798,142, an increase over the preceding year of \$1,278,572, or 36 p.c. To the total for 1927, the silver fox contributed \$4,568,716 or 95 p.c.

<u>Fur-Bearing Animals on Farms at the end of the Year:</u>- Increases in number and value, compared with the preceding year, are shown for all of the principal kinds of furbearing animals on the farms at the end of the year. The number of silver foxes was 57,961, valued at \$12,824,787, an increase in number over the preceding year of 10,304, and an increase in value of \$2,172,483. The number of blue foxes increased from 1,050 in 1926 to 1,713 in 1927, mink from 1,650 to 2,615 and raccoon from 689 to 1,238. The total number of all kinds of fur-bearing animals on the farms at the end of the year 1927 was 72,125 and the total value \$13,465,882. The silver fox represents 95 p.c. of the total value, other kinds of foxes $2\frac{1}{2}$ p.c., mink 1 p.c., and other kinds of fur-bearing animals $1\frac{1}{2}$ p.c.
