PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE FUR FARMS OF CANADA, 1928

The importance of the fur farming industry in Canada is shown by the statistics for the year 1928, just made available. The total number of fur farms in that year was 4,371 of which 3,676 were fox farms, 468 miscellaneous fur-bearing animal farms (mink, raccoon, marten, fisher, etc.) and 227 muskrat and beaver farms. The total value of property was \$22,613,891, divided as follows; land and buildings,\$6,500,888, and fur-bearing animals,\$16,113,003. The number of fur farms shows an increase over the preceding year of 806, or 23 per cent, and the value of property an increase of \$3.774,578 or 20 per cent. In the past five years the number of fur farms has increased by 252 per cent and the value of property by 168 per cent. The term "fur farm" covers properties devoted entirely to the raising of fur-bearing animals and also the sections of general farms where fur-farming is carried on as a branch of the operations. For farms are the most numerous with a total of 3,676, followed by mink farms with a total of 268, muskrat farms with 216, and raccoon farms with 157. In reports of the industry for previous years a separate section was provided for muskrat and beaver farms, as certain particulars furnished by operators of other kinds of fur farms, viz., number of fur-bearing anumals on the farm, number born, and number which died, could only be given approximately by operators of muskrat and beaver farms. It was decided, however, for the purposes of the present report, to include muskrat and beaver in all of the statistical tables, and comparative statistics for 1927 shown herein, have therefore been changed to accord with the 1928 statistical tables. It should be noted that the numbers shown for muskrat and beaver in the tables of fur-bearing animals born, died and on farms at the end of the year, are based on estimates furnished by the operators of the farms, and represent only approximately the actual numbers of these animals.

Fur-bearing Animals, Born, Died and Killed for Pelts.-

The number of fur-bearing animals born in captivity in 1928 was 168,454, or more than double the number recorded for the preceding year. The number of muskrat estimated as born was 94,359, and this number accounts for over half of the total number of furbearing animals shown as born on the farms during the year 1928. The number of silver foxes born was 57,953, an increase over the preceding year of 11,913, or 26 per cent. The number of mink born was 3,822, or nearly double the number recorded for 1927. Other kinds of fur-bearing animals born include patch or cross fox, red fox, blue fox, raccoon, skunk, marten, fisher, badger, coyote, rabbit and beaver. The number of fur-bearing animals which died on fur farms during the year, including adults and young, was 17,223, compared with a total of 14,480 in 1927. The number of animals killed for pelts was 32,609, compared with 29,800 in the preceding year.

<u>Fur-bearing Animals Sold and Pelts Sold</u>.- The farms record a total of 25,958 fur-bearing animals sold in 1928, with a total value of \$3,760,470, an increase over the preceding year of more than a million dollars. To the total for 1928 silver fox contributed \$3,475,824, or 92 per cent. The number of silver foxes sold was 17,163, compared with 12,804 in 1927. Considurable numbers of muskrat are sold to be used as foundation stock for new fur farms. The number of muskrat disposed of by the farms in 1928 was 2,647, valued at \$16,206. The number of pelts of all kinds cold from fur farms in 1928 was only slightly larger than the number shown for the preceding year, the total for each of the two years being as follows: 1927, number of pelts 30,262, value \$2,163,014; and 1928, number of pelts 30,435, value \$2,345,635. Silver fox with 21,173 pelts, valued at \$2,235,555, accounted for 95 per cent of the total value of pelts sold in 1928. The average price for silver fox pelts in 1928 was \$106, compared with \$98 in 1927 and \$83 in 1926. Patch or cross fox was next in order of total value of pelt sales, followed by red fox, blue fox, muskrat and mink.

The total revenue derived by the fur farmers from the sale of live fur-bearing animals and pelts in 1928 was \$6,106,105, to which total the sales of live fur-bearing animals contributed 62 per cent and the sales of pelts,38 per cent.

Fur-bearing Animals on Fur Farms at the end of the year .- The

total number of fur-bearing animals on the farms at the end of the year 1928, including estimates of the numbers of muskrat and beaver, was 258,373, with a total value of \$16,113,003. The number shows an increase over the preceding year of 130,353, or 102 per cent, and the value an increase of \$2,494,745, or 18 per cent. The large increase are in number may be credited chiefly to muskrat, although increases in number/shown for nearly all kinds of fur bearers. Silver fox increased from 57,961 in 1927 to 71,329 in 1928; mink from 2,615 to 5,028, and raccoon from 1,238 to 1,852. The recent rise in the price of badger pelts has led to experiments in badger farming, and the records for 1928 show 113 badger on fur farms at the end of the year. There were four badger farms in operation in that year, three of these being located in Saskatchewan and one in Alberta.

Badger is also being raised on a few of the fox farms. The value of silver foxes on 1928 farms at the end of the year/was \$14,634,208, this total representing 91 per cent of the total value of all fur-bearing animals on the faims.

The following tables give summaries of the principal statistics of the industry for the years 1927 and 1928. There are a few fur farms for which returns for the year 1928 have not yet been received. These returns will be included in the final report of the industry, which may be expected therefore to show some increase over the present preliminary figures.
