PREFACE

This Report is issued under an arrangement for statistical co-operation between the Dominion Bureau of Statistics and the Government departments having jurisdiction with regard to fisheries throughout Canada. These departments comprise: the Dominion Fisheries Department which exercises jurisdiction over the fisheries of the Maritime provinces, Yukon Territory, British Columbia and the Magdalen Islands, and the Fisheries Branches of departments of Ontario, Quebec, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta which have jurisdiction over the fisheries of their respective provinces, excepting in the case of Quebec, the fisheries of the Magdalen Islands. The province of British Columbia has a Fisheries Branch, but it does not engage in independent statistical work.

Under the arrangement above referred to, the statistics of the catch, and of the products marketed in a fresh state or domestically prepared, are collected by the local fisheries officers, checked in the Department of Fisheries, and co-ordinated and compiled in the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. In the case of manufactured fish products, schedules in conformity with those of other sections of the Census of Industry are sent by the Bureau to the operators of canneries, fish-curing establishments, etc., the fisheries officers assisting in securing an expeditious and accurate return. The grateful acknowledgments of the Bureau are tendered to the officers of the provincial governments who co-operate in these arrangements.

For reasons of economy the volumes of 1939 and 1940 omit certain reading matter and tables which were contained in the Introduction of earlier reports, among which may be mentioned: the short history of the fisheries of Canada, the annual write-up of fishing conditions during the year, and the trade table showing exports by countries of destination.



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FISHERIES STATISTICS OF CANADA, 1940

The total value of production of the fisheries of Canada for the year 1940 was \$45,118,887, compared with \$40,075,922 in 1939 and \$40,492,976 in 1938. These totals represent the value of the product as marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh, domestically prepared or factory made. Table 1, which follows, shows the quantity caught and the value marketed of the chief commercial fishes (those valued at \$100,000 or upwards) for the past five years, with a statement in the final column of the increase or decrease for 1940 compared with 1939, while table 2 gives the quantity and value of all fish as caught and marketed, for the years 1939 and 1940.

Capital Equipment and Employees

IN PRIMARY OPERATIONS

Capital.—The value of the capital equipment, consisting of the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc., used in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish in the year 1940, was \$26,221,269, of which \$21,258,608 is credited to the sea fisheries, and \$4,962,661 to the inland fisheries. Compared with the preceding year the total amount shows an increase of \$376,833.

Employees.—The number of men engaged in fishing operations during the year was 68,817, compared with 68,941 in 1939, the sea fisheries accounting for 54,816, compared with 55,205 in 1939, and the inland fisheries for 14,001 compared with 13,736.

IN FISH PROCESSING

Capital.—Fish processing plants record a total capital investment in 1940 of \$23,257,676, compared with \$21,479,200 in the preceding year. The number of establishments in operation during the year was 458, compared with 523 in 1939. The decrease in the number of plants is due to the fact that the salmon canneries of the province of Quebec, which are in general of small size, were in earlier years recorded with the fish processing establishments, whereas in 1940 the number of these and their value are included with the small fish and smoke houses shown in the primary operations of the fisheries.

Employees.—The number of persons employed in the plants during the season of operations was 15,044, compared with 14,814 in 1939.

Tables 3 to 6, which follow, contain summaries of capital equipment and employees in the primary operations and in fish processing establishments, for Canada as a whole; other summary tables present information by provinces. Statistics by counties and fishing districts will be found in Part II of the Report.

FISHING BOUNTY

Under the authority of "An Act to Encourage the Development of the Sea Fisheries and the Building of Fishing Vessels" the sum of \$160,000 is appropriated annually by the Governor in Council. It is distributed under the name of Fishing Bounty by the Department of Fisheries amongst fishermen and fishing vessel and boat owners on the Atlantic coast, under regulations made from time to time by the Governor in Council.

For the year 1940, payment was made on the following basis:—

To owners of vessels entitled to receive bounty—\$1 per registered ton; payment to the owner of any one vessel not to exceed \$80.

To vessel fishermen entitled to receive bounty—\$6.90 each.

To owners of boats measuring not less than 12 feet keel—\$1 per boat.

To boat fishermen entitled to receive bounty—\$6.60 each.

The total amount paid in 1940 was \$159,920.40, allocated as follows:—

To 711 vessels and their crews.....	\$ 37,029.90
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To 9,926 boats and their crews.....	122,890.50
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FOREIGN TRADE

Exports.—Canadian fish and fishery products exported during the 12 months ended December 31, 1940, had a total value of \$32,662,062, an increase over the preceding year of \$3,020,830, or 10 per cent. The total for 1940 is the highest recorded since 1929. Canned salmon is the principal item of export with a value of \$8,226,315. Other items with an export value of over a million dollars each in 1940 are: fresh lobster (\$2,016,561); canned sea herring (\$1,645,430); fresh salmon (\$1,507,111); and dried codfish (\$1,502,462). The export of canned lobster, which formerly was shipped in large quantities to many European countries, has been much curtailed by the War, and in 1940 the value was less than half that of the export of 1939. The export of fish meal is increasing each year and in 1940 the value reached \$1,273,041. The fish oil exports are also of importance, the shipments of the various kinds, including whale oil, showing a total value of \$992,485.

Imports.—The imports of fish in the calendar year 1940 had a total value of \$3,501,561, an increase over 1939 of \$62,917, or 2 per cent. The principal kinds imported are oysters, sardines, salmon and tuna fish. Fish oils are imported in considerable quantities, their combined values in 1940 amounting to \$883,709.



PRÉFACE

Ce rapport est publié en vertu d'une entente établissant la coopération en matière de statistique entre le Bureau Fédéral de la Statistique et les différents services gouvernementaux ayant juridiction sur les pêcheries canadiennes. Ces services comprennent le Ministère fédéral des Pêches, qui exerce sa juridiction sur les pêcheries des Provinces Maritimes, du Yukon, de la Colombie Britannique et des Iles-de-la-Madelcine, et les divisions des Pêches des provinces d'Ontario, Québec, Manitoba, Saskatchewan et Alberta, qui régissent les pêcheries de leurs provinces respectives, sauf les pêcheries des Iles-de-la-Madeleine, en Québec, lesquelles sont sous la juridiction du Ministère des Pêches du Dominion. La Colombie Britannique possède une division des Pêches, mais cet organisme ne s'occupe pas de statistique pour son propre compte.

En vertu de l'arrangement dont il est parlé plus haut, les statistiques du poisson pêché et des produits offerts en vente à l'état frais ou après une préparation sommaire, sont recueillies par les fonctionnaires locaux du Ministère des Pêches, vérifiées et condensées au Ministère des Pêches, puis compilées au Bureau Fédéral de la Statistique. En ce qui concerne le poisson industriellement préparé et ses sous-produits, des formules similaires à celles en usage dans le recensement des autres branches de la production sont envoyées directement par le Bureau aux usines poissonnières, les fonctionnaires des services des Pêches s'assurant que ces formules sont consciencieusement remplies et promptement retournées. Les fonctionnaires des gouvernements provinciaux voudront bien accepter nos remerciements pour le concours qu'ils nous ont prêté.

Pour raisons d'économie les rapports de 1939 et de 1940 omettent du texte et des tableaux, contenus dans l'Introduction des rapports antérieurs, dont on peut mentionner: l'historique des pêcheries au Canada, le résumé annuel des conditions de la pêche durant l'année et le tableau du commerce donnant les exportations par pays de destination.

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STATISTIQUES DES PÊCHERIES DU CANADA, 1940

La valeur totale de la production des pêcheries du Canada en 1940 est de \$45,118,887 contre \$40,075,922 en 1939 et \$40,492,976 en 1938. Ces chiffres représentent la valeur des produits tels que vendus, livrés à la consommation immédiate, préparés par les pêcheurs ou transformés dans un établissement. Le tableau 1, qui suit, montre les prises et la valeur marchande des principaux poissons commerciaux (valant \$100,000 et plus) ces cinq dernières années; la dernière colonne fait voir l'augmentation ou la diminution sur 1939 en 1940. Outilage—Capital et employés**DANS LES OPÉRATIONS PRIMAIRES**

Capital.—Les immobilisations en fait de vaisseaux, barques, filets, pièges et quais et môles, etc., employés dans les opérations primaires de la prise et du débarquement du poisson en 1940, sont de \$26,221,269, dont \$21,258,608 pour les pêcheries maritimes et \$4,962,661 pour les pêcheries intérieures. En regard de l'an dernier le total augmente de \$376,833.

Employés.—Le nombre d'hommes engagés dans les pêcheries pendant l'année s'élève à 68,817 contre 68,941 en 1939, soit 54,816 dans les pêcheries maritimes comparativement à 55,205 en 1939 et 14,001 dans les pêcheries intérieures contre 13,736.

DANS LES CONSERVERIES ET SAURISSERIES

Capital.—Les immobilisations globales de l'industrie de la transformation du poisson se chiffrent à \$23,257,676 en 1940, à rapprocher de \$21,479,200 l'année précédente. Le nombre d'établissements en opération est de 458 pendant l'année comparativement à 523 en 1939. La diminution du nombre

de fabriques est principalement attribuable au fait que les saumoneries de la province de Québec, qui sont en général de petites dimensions, étaient relevées avec les établissements de préparation du poisson au cours des années antérieures, tandis qu'en 1940 leur nombre et la valeur de leurs produits sont compris avec ceux des petites poissonneries et fumoirs relevés dans les opérations primaires des pêcheries.

Employés.—Le nombre de personnes employées dans ces établissements pendant la saison des opérations est de 15,044, comparativement à 14,814 en 1939.

Les tableaux 3 à 6 qui suivent montrent en résumé l'outillage-capital et les employés dans les opérations primaires et dans les conserveries et saurisseries pour l'ensemble du Canada; d'autres tableaux présentent les statistiques par province, tandis que la Partie II du rapport donne les statistiques par comté et district de pêche.

Primes

En vertu d'une "Loi pour encourager le développement des pêcheries maritimes et la construction des navires de pêche", une somme de \$160,000 est donnée en primes chaque année par le Gouverneur en Conseil. Sous le nom de primes de pêche, elles sont distribuées par le Ministère des Pêcheries parmi les pêcheurs et les propriétaires de navires et barques de pêche du littoral de l'Atlantique selon les règlements édictés de temps à autre par le Gouverneur en Conseil.

En 1940 les versements sont effectués sur la base suivante:—

Aux propriétaires de navires de pêche ayant droit à cette prime, \$1 par tonne enregistrée; avec un maximum de \$80 par navire.

A chaque membre de l'équipage ayant droit à la prime, \$6.90.

Aux propriétaires de barques mesurant au moins 12 pieds de quille, \$1 par embarcation.

A chaque pêcheur d'une barque ayant droit à une prime, \$6.60.

Le montant payé en 1940 est de \$159,920.40, réparti comme suit:

A 711 propriétaires de navires et leurs équipages.....\$ 37,029.90

A 9,926 propriétaires de barques et leurs équipages....\$ 122,890.50

Commerce extérieur

Exportations.—Les exportations de poisson et de produits poissonniers canadiens au cours des douze mois terminés le 31 décembre 1941 ont une valeur globale de \$32,662,062, augmentation de \$3,020,830 ou de 10 p.c. sur celles de l'année précédente. Le total de 1940 est le plus considérable depuis 1929. Le saumon en boîte est le principal item d'exportation avec une valeur de \$8,226,315. Les autres item dont la valeur d'exportation excède \$1,000,000 en 1940 sont les suivants: homard frais (\$2,016,561); hareng de mer en boîte (\$1,645,430); saumon frais (\$1,507,111); morue séchée (\$1,502,462). Les exportations de homard en boîte, qui étaient autrefois dirigées en grandes quantités vers plusieurs pays d'Europe, ont été beaucoup restreintes par la guerre et en 1940 la valeur est inférieure à la moitié de ce qu'elle était en 1939. Les exportations de poudre de poisson augmentent chaque année et en 1940 elles s'élèvent à \$1,273,041. Les exportations d'huile de poisson sont également importantes; les expéditions de diverses sortes, y compris l'huile de baleine, ont une valeur globale de \$992,485.

Importations.—Les importations de poisson au cours de l'année civile 1940 ont une valeur globale de \$3,501,561, augmentation de \$62,917 ou de 2. p.c. sur celles de 1939. Les principales espèces importées sont les huîtres, la sardine, le saumon et le thon. Les huiles de poisson sont importées en quantités considérables, leur valeur globale s'élevant à \$883,709 en 1940.

Le poids du flitan est pris après l'enlèvement de la tête et des entrailles. Dans le cas de l'espadon et du thon le poids comprend le poisson après l'enlèvement de la tête, de la queue et des entrailles. Pour tous les autres poissons le terme "poisson frais" signifie le poisson tel qu'il est sorti de l'eau.
