. THE FISHERIES OF NEW BRUNSWICK, 1924

The following preliminary report of the fisheries of New Brunswick for the year 1924 is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Marine and Fisheries.

PRODUCTION

The product of the fisheries of New Brunswick in 1924, comprising fish sold for consumption fresh and fish canned, cured or otherwise prepared, had a total market value of \$5,383,286, an increase over the preceding year of \$834,751 or 18 per cent. All of the principal varieties, excepting lobsters, showed increases in total value. The sardine fishery had a product valued at \$1,241,508, which is the largest annual output for this fishery since 1918. The quantity of sardines caught during the year 1924 showed an increase of 100 per cent over the catch of the preceding year. The lobster fishery on the other hand showed a decrease both in catch and in value of product. In 1923 the value of the lobsters marketed in shell and canned was \$1,339,155, and in 1924 the value was \$1,203,564, a decrease of \$135,591. Following sardines and lobsters in order of value in 1924 are smelts, \$844,730; cod, \$643,321; salmon, \$425,800; herring, \$367,037; clams, \$137,093; and oysters, \$103,040. The smelt and salmon fisheries showed increases over the preceding year in value of product of 45 per cent and 70 per cent respectively.

. Capital Equipment and Employees

Primary Operations:- The amount of capital represented in the vessels, boats, nets, traps, piers and wharves, etc., engaged in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish was \$3,676,800, compared with \$3,400,169 in 1923. The number of men employed in these operations was 8,743 in 1924 and 9,228 in 1923.

Fish Canning and Curing Establishments:- The number of establishments in operation in 1924 was 125, comprising 142 lobster canneries, 5 clam canneries, 3 sardine canneries and 45 fish curing establishments. Compared with the preceding year a decrease of 45 is shown in the number of lobster canneries: increases of 3 and 6 respectively are shown in the number of sardine canneries and fish

curing establishments. The amount of capital invested in the establishments was \$1,678,997, compared with \$1,174,448 in 1923. There were 2,106 persons employed in the establishments, for periods ranging from 6 weeks to the full year, and the salaries and wages paid amounted to \$280,235. In the preceding year the employees numbered 2,256 and the salaries and wages amounted to \$285,851.
