PRELIMINARY REPORT ON THE FISHERIES OF NOVA SCOTIA, 1927.

The following preliminary report of the fisheries of Nova Scotia is issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Marine and Fisheries.

PRODUCTION

The value of production of the fisheries of Nova Scotia for the year 1927 was \$10,783,631, a decrease from the preceding year of \$1,722,291 or $13\frac{1}{2}$ p.c. The value given represents the total value of the fish marketed, whether sold for consumption fresh or canned, cured or otherwise prepared. Most of the principal kinds of fish show decreases, both in catch and in marketed value, the exceptions being hake and cusk, halibut, mackerel and scallops. Cod is of chief importance with a total marketed value of \$3,455,772, a decrease from the preceding year of \$1,197,086, or $25\frac{1}{2}$ p.c. The production of dried cod decreased by 33 p.c. The lobster fishery is second in importance, with a product valued at \$3,255,627, a decrease from 1926 of \$130,789, or $3\frac{1}{2}$ p.c. Haddock had a total marketed value of \$1,402,135. The marketed value of halibut was \$468,679, an increase over the preceding year of \$86,959, or $22\frac{1}{2}$ p.c. The value of mackerel shows an increase of 18 p.c. and of scallops an increase of $5\frac{1}{2}$ p.c.

Statistics of fish caught and landed and the form in which marketed are given in table 1, while totals for a period of years are given in tables " and 3.

CAPITAL EQUIPMENT AND EMPLOYEES

PRIMARY OPERATIONS:

Capital. - The amount of capital invested in the vessels, boats, gear, etc. employed in the primary operations of catching and landing the fish was \$8,162,060, compared with \$7,979,774 in 1926.

Employees. - The number of men employed in these operations in 1927 was 16,157, compared with 16,315 in the preceding year.

FISH CANNING AND CURING ESTABLISH ENTS:

Capital. The value of the capital investment of the fish canning and curing establishments in 1927 was \$3,298,499, a decrease of \$816,155 from the preceding rear. The number of establishments in operation in 1927 was 225, comprising 124 lobster canneries, 6 clam canneries, 3 sardine and other fish canneries, 85 fish curing establishments, and 7 reduction plants. The number of lobster canneries shows a decrease of 9 from the preceding year, the number of clam canneries a decrease of 1, and the number of fish curing establishments a decrease of 12, while the numbers of reduction plants and sardine and other fish canneries show increases of 3 and 1 respectively.

Employees. - The number of persons employed in the establishments was 3,609, compared with 3,876 in 1926.

Statistics of capital and employees are given in table 4.
